SPACE HEATERS SAFETY

Many families choose to use portable electric space heaters to help heat their homes in winter. While space heaters can provide supplemental heat, they also increase the risks of fire and electric shock if not used properly. Keep your home warm and your family safe by following simple safety precautions:

- Read the manufacturer's instruction manual before using any space heater.
- Check to make sure the heater bears the mark of a nationally recognized testing laboratory i.e. Underwriters Laboratories (UL), Canadian Standards Association (CSA) or Intertek (ETL).
- Keep space heaters at least **3 feet away** from any combustible materials, such as bedding, clothing, draperies, furniture, rugs, and holiday decorations.
- Do not use space heaters in wet or damp areas such as bathrooms unless the manufacturer's instructions indicate that it is intended for this use.
- Do not use space heaters in rooms where children are unsupervised. Children may stick their fingers or other objects through the protective guards, causing burns or shock.
- Portable heaters have hot parts that can cause sparking. Do not use them where flammable liquids such as gasoline or kerosene are used or stored. Space heaters are meant to supply supplemental heat. Don't use them to warm bedding, cook food, dry clothing or thaw pipes.
- Plug portable space heaters directly into an outlet; do not use an extension cord. Make certain the circuit you plug a space heater can adequately and safely handle the added demand.
- Unplug and safely store portable space heaters when not in use.

Did You Know? According to the Nation Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Based on 2012-2016 annual averages:

Most home heating fire deaths (86%) involved stationary or portable space heaters. The leading factor contributing to home heating fires (27%) was failure to clean, principally from solid-fueled heating equipment, primarily chimneys. The leading factor contributing to ignition for home heating fire deaths (54%) was heating equipment too close to things that can burn, such as upholstered furniture, clothing, mattress, or bedding. Nearly half (48%) of all home heating fires occurred in December, January and February.
