#### A MESSAGE FROM OUR FIRE DEPARTMENT ABOUT CARBON MONOXIDE POISONING

Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide (CO) is an invisible, odorless, colorless gas created when fuels (such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane) burn incompletely. Heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel can be sources of carbon monoxide.

- CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home and in other locations where required by applicable laws, codes or standards. For the best protection, interconnect all CO alarms so when one sounds, they all do.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions for placement and mounting.
- Choose a CO alarm that is listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Call your local fire department's non-emergency number to find out what number to call if the CO alarm sounds.
- Test CO alarms at least once a month; replace them according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- If the audible trouble signal sounds, check for low batteries. If the battery is low, replace it. If it still sounds, call the fire department.
- If the CO alarm sounds, immediately move to a fresh air location outdoors or by an open window or door. Make sure everyone inside the home is accounted for. Call for help from a fresh air location and stay there until emergency personnel declare it is safe to re-enter the home.
- Do not run a vehicle or other fueled engine or motor indoors, even if garage doors are open. Make sure the exhaust pipe of a running vehicle is not covered with snow.
- During and after a snowstorm, make sure vents for the dryer, furnace, stove, and fireplace are clear of snow build-up.
- A generator should be used in a well-ventilated location outdoors away from windows, doors and vent openings.
- Gas or charcoal grills can produce CO — only use outside.

**Know the Symptoms of CO Poisoning** - Because CO is odorless, colorless, and otherwise undetectable to the human senses; people may not know that they are being exposed. The initial symptoms of low to moderate CO poisoning are similar to the flu (but without the fever). They include: Headache, Fatigue, Shortness of breath, Nausea, Dizziness. Sometimes People/Physicians can mistake CO Poisoning as the Flu. High level CO poisoning results in progressively more severe symptoms, including: Mental confusion, Vomiting, Loss of muscular coordination, Loss of consciousness and ultimately death.

#### **Safety Tips**

- Have your home heating systems (including chimneys and vents) inspected and serviced annually by a trained service technician.
- Never leave a car running in an attached garage.
- Never use portable generators inside homes or garages, even if doors and windows are open. Use generators outside far away from the home.
- Never bring a charcoal grill into the house for heating or cooking. Do not barbeque in the garage.
- Never use a gas range or oven for heating.
- Open the fireplace damper before lighting a fire and keep it open until the ashes are cool. An open damper may help prevent build-up of poisonous gases inside the home.
- Never ignore a sounding CO alarm. It is warning you of a potentially deadly hazard. If the alarm signal goes off, do not try to find the source of the CO. Immediately move to a meeting place outside your residence.

**Please leave your windows and doors closed.** It makes it a lot easier for emergency personnel to identify where the problem may be. **Call 911.** Replace CO alarms per manufacturers recommendations. Typical replacement time frame is 7 to 10 years.

Contrary to advertisements, these items are **not** sewer system friendly and, significantly increase the likelihood of a sanitary sewer backup in your basement and/or your neighbors'. Sewer backups caused by these products can occur rapidly. The city will not be responsible for the backup or any related damages. Please do not dispose of paper or plastic products (beyond toilet tissue) in your toilet or other drains. The home you save may be your own. Thank you.
