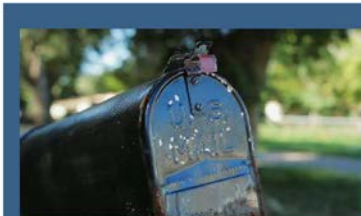
The 2020 Census is underway - more than half the households across America have responded - and more are responding every day. Online, phone and mailed self-responses will continue throughout the data collection process.

## Voting & COVID 19



Traditional Polling Locations will not be available for the June Primary. All voters are encouraged to vote by mail.

#### Primary Election

- Ballots will be mailed beginning June 9, 2020
- Ballots must be postmarked by June 30<sup>th</sup>.
- Return your ballot early, recommended mail by date is no later than June 26<sup>th</sup>.

**Vote by Mail**



There will be only one polling location on Election Day at the Davis County Legacy Center, 131 South 1100 West, Farmington.

This will be a drive-thru only location. The location is established to assist voters with disabilities or voters who have not received a ballot in the mail.

If you can vote by mail, please do.

#### Changes to Voting

The State Legislature passed HB3005 during a special session on April 22, 2020. This bill made substantial changes to how the Primary Election is administered.

- No Early Voting
- No In-Person Voter Registration
- No Election Day Voter Registration
- Limited Election Day Voting
- Ballots may only be sent to voters affiliated with a participating party or to unaffiliated voters who qualify and have requested a ballot.

Davis County is committed to making this election as accessible and open as possible under these new requirements.

- Unaffiliated Voters will receive a questionnaire to request a ballot
- Ballots will be mailed to all eligible voters 3 weeks before the election
- Return Postage will be paid
- Ballot drop boxes will be available at all City Offices through June 29<sup>th</sup>
- A single drive-thru polling location will be centrally located in the County and will be open on Election Day from 7am-8pm

#### Prepare for the Election Now

#### In a Primary Election

##### Party Affiliation Matters



If you want to participate in the Democratic Primary you must be registered Democratic, or registered as Unaffiliated and request a Democratic ballot. (1<sup>st</sup> Congressional District only)



If you want to participate in the Republican Primary you must be registered Republican.

### ROUND A BOUT INFO

Round-a-bouts in Clinton City provide safer and more efficient traffic flow than standard intersections. They keep traffic moving one-way in a counterclockwise direction, providing for fewer conflict points which allows traffic to flow more smoothly.

Follow these steps for driving in the round-a-bouts:

- Slow down and obey traffic signs;
- Yield to pedestrians and bicyclists;
- **Yield to traffic already in the round-a-bout;**
- Enter the round-a-bout when there is a safe gap in traffic;
- Keep your speed low within the round-a-bout;
- As you approach your exit, turn on your right turn signal.

**Contact Football Registration**

Registration starts for contact football begins June 1<sup>st</sup> and runs through July 2<sup>nd</sup>. **NO LATE REGISTRATIONS!** League rules require that participants must register in the city in which they live. Contact Football: Ages 7-15, must weigh at least 40 lbs and not in be in high school. Cost is \$110. Packets can be picked up in the Recreation office or found online and must be completed and all documentation provided at the time of registration.

**Flag Football Registration**

Registration starts for Flag football Jun 1<sup>st</sup> and runs thru Jul 31<sup>st</sup>. Flag Football: Co-ed ages 1<sup>st</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> grade. Cost is \$50 resident and \$55 non-resident. The season runs August – October.

**Fall Soccer Registration**

Registration runs from June 1<sup>st</sup> – July 17<sup>th</sup>. Cost is \$50.00 for Residents and \$55.00 for Non-Residents. The season runs August - October.
