CLINTON CITY EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

Now is a good time to sign up for the Clinton City Emergency Notification System. To do so, click on the **Red Phone** (below) or go to www.clintoncity.com and click on the **Red Phone** there. By registering, you can specify how you will receive notifications and you can keep your profile updated with accurate contact information to insure you are notified of important information or of an emergency.

In late 2019, Clinton City upgraded to a new notification provider tied directly to our website. If you previously signed up and have not logged in prior to December 2019, due to the migration to the new system, it may be necessary to recreate your password. We have made every effort to transfer as much contact information as possible.

To recreate your password click on the link <https://clintoncityut.reggroup.com/login> or retype it in your browser, choose login, then put your email address in and choose the reset password option, this will cause the system to send you a password reset link. With this new system, an email is required; if you do not have an email address please contact Lisa at 801-614-0700.

Please note that our Emergency Notification System is automatically and regularly updated through our Utility Billing system. If your information on file is not accurate, and you have not registered on our website, you may **NOT** receive EMERGENCY NOTICES. Please call our Utilities Department at 801-614-0700 to update your billing contact information.

If you are an owner of a rental property, please **ENCOURAGE** your renters to register for notifications on our website, as this is the only way they will receive notifications or alerts. Thank you!

FREE SHRED DAY EVENT FOR RESIDENTS: **Saturday, May 16, 10:00 am – Noon - 2267 N 1500 W.**

Clinton residents can bring paper, staples & paperclips, black binder clips, hanging file folders, magazines & phone books, spiral notebooks, two-part equi-fasteners, checks, brass fasteners, brochures and rubber bands to the west side of the city hall parking lot to shred on site.

Please be prepared to show proof of residency.

PLEASE CONSIDER WHAT YOU PUT DOWN YOUR SINKS AND TOILETS

Paper towels, baby wipes, cleaning wipes, cooking grease, diapers, sanitary napkins, dental floss and any other paper, plastic or cloth materials contribute to sewer blockages and pump failures in the sewer collection system.

City crews are struggling to keep pipes in our system clear of disposable wipes and scrubbers like those advertised on TV. Contrary to advertisements, these items are **not** sewer system friendly and, significantly increase the likelihood of a sanitary sewer backup in your basement and/or your neighbors'. Sewer backups caused by these products can occur rapidly. The city will not be responsible for the backup or any related damages. Please do not dispose of paper or plastic products (beyond toilet tissue) in your toilet or other drains. The home you save may be your own. Thank you.

In an effort to follow social distancing guidelines and to protect our citizens, community and employees from the spread of Corona Virus, Clinton City is encouraging residents to continue to pay their utility bill thru Express Bill Pay at www.clintoncity.net, over the phone by calling **801-614-0700** or by placing your payment in the utility payment dropbox located in the City Offices parking lot at 2267 N 1500 W.

We would like to encourage our residents to consider paying their utility bill online by signing up for our online payment service provider Xpress Bill Pay which is **FREE** of charge.

Or, many banks and credit unions also offer online bill payment, check with your financial institution to see what services they offer for this option.

Heritage Days Celebration

In an effort to follow the Utah Leads Together plan for a health and economic recovery put out by the State of Utah’s Economic Response Task Force, the Clinton City Administration has decided to cancel the Heritage Days Celebration for the summer of 2020. We look forward to celebrating the city’s Heritage in 2021.

Recreation Programs and Activities

As the state of Utah moves into the “Stabilization Phase” of the Utah Leads Together plan, which does not allow gatherings of more than twenty people, organized sports or activities and senior citizen programs, the city’s recreation department will not be offering any of the following programs: Youth Baseball/Softball, Club 55, Art Class, Summer Classes and Camps, Hunters Education and Adult Softball and Kickball. The Youth Spring Soccer program that was in progress before the Governor issued his Stay Home Stay Safe Directive is on postponement until the city receives notice from the Davis County Health Department on its directives.

All fall recreation programs are TBA as we receive direction from the State of Utah’s Economic Response Task Force and the Davis County Health Department.

Tree/Shrub Trimming Reminder: It is the homeowner’s responsibility to maintain all trees and shrubs in their park strip. Please get them trimmed now so that our street sweepers can do their job this summer. The City Code (25-16-5) states: “All shrubs and trees shall be pruned to permit plain view of regulatory (street and stop) and caution signs, utility accesses, and so that they do not overhang the curb in the street twelve (12) feet or the sidewalk eight (8) feet.”

Fact Sheet



It is important that everyone be represented in Utah and the way to do that is by taking the census. However, there is a lot you may not know about it. Get to know the census and how it impacts you— you may be surprised.

Census 101	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The U.S. Constitution requires a national census every 10 years. The goal is to count every resident of the United States where they are living on April 1 regardless of age, ethnic group, citizenship or residency status. For the first time, the 2020 Census will be offered online as well as by mail or phone.
Representation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The census determines political representation from congressional seats to city councils. Utah gained a congressional seat following the 2010 Census, and has continued to grow. In the 2000 Census, Utah missed out on a fourth seat by just 857 people—showing the importance of counting every Utahn. Census numbers guide district boundaries for Congress, the Legislature, county commissions, city councils and school boards.
Funding	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Data collected from the census determines the distribution of more than \$675 billion nationally in federal funding for education programs, transportation projects and social programs, impacting the lives of all of us in Utah.
Infrastructure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Infrastructure decisions, from road repairs to transit developments, use census counts as a determining factor to ensure the highest possible impact of construction projects.
Public Safety	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Public safety uses census numbers to guide decisions about service areas as well as fire stations, police precincts and hospitals. During and after a natural disaster, emergency managers use census numbers to plan rescue, recovery and rebuilding efforts.
Privacy & Security	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> By law, all information gathered by the census is confidential. Answers can only be used to produce statistics with no personal identifiers. Information gathered by the census cannot be used against individuals by a government agency or law enforcement. The 2020 Census will not include any questions about citizenship status.
